



Past International President Curtis D. Lovill Passes Away

Past International President Curtis D. Lovill, of Gardiner, Maine, passed away March 20 at the age of 82 years. Death was attributed to a heart attack.

He served as International President in 1962-63, as an International Director in 1950-52 and as a District Governor in 1944-46. He was a charter member of the Gardiner Lions Club, and for his contributions to Lionism had received the Extension Award, Senior Master Key and the Ambassador of Goodwill Award.

Mr. Lovill had been the editor and publisher of two newspapers and his community activities included the presidency of his school district, director of a hospital and presidency of the Lions-sponsored Maine Sight Conservation Association, Inc.

He is survived by his wife Mary. Funeral services were held on March 23 in Gardiner and International President Bert Mason appointed Past International President John Stickley and Past International Director Joseph Camarda to represent the Association.
