



Past International President Karl M. Sorrick Dies



Karl M. Sorrick, who served as President of our International Association in 1940-41, died November 6 at the age of 92.

He had devoted 62 years to Lionism, beginning in 1921 when he helped charter the Jackson Host, Michigan, Lions Club. He was a Life Member of that Club.

Lion Sorrick served as International Director in 1934-36, after serving his Club and District in various offices.

In addition to his business interests, Past President Sorrick had operated a 40-acre farm near Jackson, Michigan.

He was elected to the Third Vice-Presidency in 1937 at the Association's International Convention in Chicago, and became International President at the Havana, Cuba, Convention in 1940.

A scholarship fund has been established in his memory by the Jackson Host Lions Club.
