According to his music teacher, though, Raymond needs to practice on a real plane to increase the strength in his hands and fingers. Unfortunately, unexpected financial problems prevented the family from purchasing the \$800 upright piano Raymond wanted.

That's when the Susquehanna Lions Club stepped in and agreed to purchase the piano for Raymond. But Christmas was rapidly approaching, and we so other holiday projects, money was still an issue.

But the club was undaunted. "We decided, one way or another, this boy's going to have a piano," says third vice-president Mike Sprout.

Lions negotiated with the piano store to delay payment until the funds could be raised. Santa delivered the piano right on schedule, and Raymond was thrilled.

"I think I'll remember the expression on his face the rest of my life" says Bob Shenberger, Raymond's stepfather.

The story doesn't end there. An article about the Susquehanna Lions' efforts to brighten Raymond's Christmas appeared in a local newspaper. This sourced a community response unlike anything the club had ever seen. In less than a week \$3,000 poured in from citizens wanting to help Raymond get his piano.
