"We are very pleased with the result of this Honor Patrol," reports a club member, "because we have been told that this trip was the direct cause of having six boys invested as Eagle Scouts this year. The competition within the troop has been so keen that the boys made allout efforts to be the ones eligible to go on the trip this year."

This is the third year that the club has sponsored the camping trip.

TV Auction Success To Tune of \$1,500

Nearly \$1,500 was raised when the South Joplin, Mo., Lions held their annual "TV Auction" earlier this year. Sixty articles of merchandise, donated by Joplin business firms, were auctioned during the three-hour event.

Auction items are displayed in a central downtown location ten days prior to the auction. Bids on particular items may be submitted by mail anytime up to the date of the auction. The bidding starts with the highest mail bid—viewers submit subsequent bids by telephone. Each item is on camera for about two minutes, during which time phone bids are taken. The highest bidder at the end of this period receives the article, which he claims the following day.

KODE-TV station personalities conduct the auction; members of the Lions club man the telephones. The project has proved a reliable fund-raiser as well as a popular program with viewers. Proceeds are used to purchase glasses for needy children, to help finance the Lions eye tissue program, and to support other youth programs.

Small Club Constructs Boy Scout Center

Grandfalls, Texas Lions, a club of only 16 members, has long sponsored Boy Scout troops. Last year they began construction of a Scout building in the city park. The foundation was built and tile walls were constructed. All was progressing well until a strong Texas wind blew down sections of the walls. The Lions had to begin the project anew.

Since September of last year, Grandfalls Lions, directed by H. E. Jenkins and Construction Chief Harold Ward, have reconstructed the walls, placed a roof on the hall and decorated the interior. To accomplish all this, the Lions have sold razor blades, solicited donations, gathered and sold scrap iron, and sponsored a pancake supper.
